

1 ‘Why can’t they leave us alone?’ (BOYS OR MIXED)

B1 I’m really fed up. Why can’t they just leave us alone?

B2 It’s a kind of bullying.

B1 Except the teachers won’t do anything about it. They think we’re big enough to look after ourselves.

B2 Just because we do things together they call us gay.

B1 Do they think we’re actually going to become gays?

B2 They don’t think anything. They probably think if they call us gay, they’re safe from being called gay themselves.

B1 Anyway, so what?

B2 ‘So what’ – what?

B1 So what if we do have gay feelings, it’s normal and we shouldn’t be bullied.

- B1 And you can't get out the water?**
- B2 Yeah! I mean that's really embarrassing!**
- B1 It's alright for girls – all they do is take the mick.**
- B2 They don't understand it either. They think we're perverts, but it's nothing to do with sex. I could be thinking about my stunt bike, homework or anything and get a stiffy.**
- B1 Yeah, you're right it's got nothing to do with sex.**
- B2 I wonder if girls get turned on?**
- B1 They've got hormones, the same as us.**
- B2 It wouldn't show.**
- B1 Just as well. Things could get really out of control.**

- B1 Yeah but I don't know how to even tell her.**

- B1 I'll never be able to tell her. She's so fit the words never seem to come out when she's in front of me.**
- B2 Well don't talk to her.**
- B1 Eh?**
- B2 Text her. Or message her using facebook..**
- B1 I've got her mobile number – I could ask her for her facebook name.**
- B2 If she gave it to you, you'd definitely be in with a chance.**
- B1 She always texts me back when I text her. Maybe she does fancy me.**
- B2 What does she say?**
- B1 Look, I keep them all.**
- B2 Let's have a look? What? She said that?**
- B1 Yeah**
- B2 No problems there. You don't need facebook. Just ask her what she's doing on Saturday.**

B2 What do you mean?

B2 Well, she puts her arms around when we kiss.
B1 No... I mean has she touched you down there... your todger, your knob?
B2 No way! We're not up for that!
B1 Go for it this weekend. Anniversary present.

2. 'Rumours' (*GIRLS OR MIXED*)

G1 See you lunchtime?

G2 Not sure!

G1 Why not, I thought you were my mate.

G2 I am. I really, really like you, but there's rumours going round.

G1 Like what?

G2 Even some of the girls in year 7 have been calling us gay and lezzies.

G1 Let's beat 'em up. Who is it anyway?

G2 You know Yaz? Well, she's always jealous of the time we spend together. 'Cos I used to be her best friend.

G1 Don't tell me she's been telling her little sister.

G2 Yeah. That we're gay. She's going 'round saying we're gay.

G1 You're right it must be her – the cow.

G2 If we meet at lunchtime, she'll start on us all over again.

G1 You going to let that cow stop us from eating at the same table?

G2 Yeah, but it's embarrassing.

G1 Well I'm not embarrassed – you're my mate, my girlfriend, it's our business – and I'll be sitting at the same table anyway.

- B1 There's another girl in Year 11 who got pregnant.**
G1 Probably on purpose.
B1 Why?
G1 I don't know, maybe she wanted the attention.
G2 Maybe she thought she'd get a flat or something and benefits.
B2 Maybe it was an accident.
B1 What do you mean?
B2 Condom split.
G1 No chance, they don't just split. She never used one, more like.
B1 Why not?
G2 Too scared to ask.
B1 Against her religion.
B2 What religion?
B1 Could be she's Catholic.
G2 Orthodox Jew maybe?
G1 That's a load of rubbish. If she was religious she wouldn't be having sex at all.
G2 Religions aren't against sex.
B1 They're against sex outside marriage.
G2 They're against sex outside a club!!

Why is it that many religious people view sex outside marriage or a committed relationship as wrong?

Many religious and non-religious people view masturbation as wrong – why might this be?

- F1 Mum's really hacking me off.**
- F2 So what's new?**
- F1 You mean what isn't new! My old mobile. That's what isn't new. I need a new mobile.**
- F2 You should have an older sister.**
- F1 Why?**
- F2 She'd pass down her old phone, which isn't very old. Look!**
- F1 It's an iPhone. You lucky . . .!! That's the one I wanted.**
- F2 Loadsa games and iTunes.**
- F1 See, that's what I need, and mum just hasn't got a clue. All she wants is for me to be home straight after school.**
- F2 Same for me. Mum's always calling me back from Jo's. I need some social life.**
- F1 I think my mum thinks I'm chatting up Chrissy. In the week it's homework and in bed for 9.30. I don't get the chance to do any chatting up?**

G2 Then we're both sad because I could never fancy Rikki.
